Keeping poultry in the City of Belmont is permitted provided you comply with the following:

Limitation on Numbers of Poultry

Note: "Poultry" includes fowls, peafowls, pigeons, doves, ducks and other domestic fowls.

- No more than a combined total of twelve poultry can be kept on any one property.

(A person affiliated with a poultry or pigeon club may apply for approval to keep more birds).

Conditions of Keeping Poultry

- Poultry is not to be kept closer than 15 metres from any house or building where people are employed.

- No poultry can be within 18 metres of a street other than a right of way unless Council approval has been given.
- All poultry is to be provided with a properly constructed structure with a floor made of cement, trowelled to a smooth finish and laid with a fall of 1 in 50 to the front and situated no closer than 1.2m to any property boundary.
- The structure must be in a fenced area of at least 30sqm.
- All enclosures and structures in which poultry & feed are kept shall be maintained in a clean condition.

Roosters, Geese, Peacocks or Turkeys

No-one is permitted to keep a rooster, goose, peacock or turkey without the written approval of the Manager - Health Services.
