The History of the City of Belmont

The municipality of Belmont was established in 1898 as the Belmont Road Board. Today, the City of Belmont – City of Opportunity is a thriving municipality with extensive parklands and some outstanding facilities such as Belmont Hub which houses the Ruth Faulkner Library, Belmont Museum and much more.

External Provider Information

City of Belmont children's program facilitators and children's program volunteers have a current Working with Children Check. It is a pre-employment requirement that staff of the City of Belmont provide a National Police Clearance.



Some City of Belmont staff hold current senior first-aid certificates. First Aid kits are available throughout the Belmont Hub.

Emergency Response Plan

In the event of an emergency it is essential that all school visitors follow directions from City of Belmont staff and wardens who will be wearing red or yellow hats.

Belmont Hub is equipped with an Emergency Warning System. A siren will indicate when an evacuation is underway. If evacuation is required all visitors will be assembled at the closest muster point as directed by wardens.

Teachers will need to do a roll call and must immediately notify City of Belmont wardens if any students are missing. It is highly recommended that school supervisory teams have access to a list of names of participating students, supervisors' contact telephone numbers, student medical information and relevant health information of supervisors.

While some of our staff members have first aid training, it is the respnsibility of the school to provide basic first aid to the students. Our staff will assist if possible.

Supervisor/Supervisory Team

It is a school requirement to provide a supervisory team for excursions to Belmont Hub. The school supervisory team must accompany students throughout the excursion, actively monitor behaviour and intervene as necessary. School supervisory teams are encouraged to prepare students for the visit by outlining expected behaviour and learning outcomes.

City of Belmont staff members are located throughout Belmont Hub, and while they will not undertake any role in a supervisory context, they will intervene where behaviour or activities put displays and/or the safety of individuals and other visitors at risk.

Supervision Strategies

The City of Belmont requires a ratio of 1 adult to 6 students, with a mandatory minimum of 2 supervisors per school supervisory team.

We recommend that each adult helper be responsible for a small group of children. Please ensure that each adult supervisor is aware of their role in regards to the behaviour and safety of your students.

Identification of Excursion Participants

Identification of excursion participants is the responsibility of the visiting school. It can be useful to City of Belmont staff if students are dressed in school uniform, for clear identification, and if the school supervisory team members wear a name badge.

City of Belmont staff members will be present at all times and will wear a uniform and name badge.

Belmont Hub

Purpose of the Excursion

Belmont Hub caters learning experiences to students of all ages. Ruth Faulkner Library and Belmont Museum offer a range of facilitated programs for school students, led by our experienced team of facilitators and volunteers. Self-guided experiences are also available for those classes who wish to explore the library and museum on their own. All learning experiences have been developed to support the Australian Curriculum, in History, English and critical and creative thinking learning areas. Excursions to Belmont Hub provide an opportunity to engage with historical artefacts, stories and specialist information.

Environment

Belmont Hub is a state-of-the-art smart building and is fully accessible. Please advise if you have any participants with special needs so we can ensure full participation during the visit.

Toilets (including wheelchair accessible toilets) and water bottle refill stations can be found on both levels of Belmont Hub. The surrounding plaza areas comprise a paved open area, an edible garden and the adjacent Faulkner and Volcano Parks. These parks offer grassed areas, a gazebo, and play equipment. Faulkner Park also features a shallow lake. Volcano Park is surrounded by a fence, with self-closing gates along both Progress Way and Abernathy Road. Water refill stations area also accessible within Volcano Park.

Belmont Hub has limited space available for storage of lunches and school bags. It is preferred that school bags are not brought on site and lunches are stored in a large tub, which can be left in a designated area. Please note that the area may not be secured.

Transport

Transport to and from the venue remains the responsibility of the visiting school. Belmont Hub is accessible by public transport. Belmont Forum bus stops are situated directly outside the building on Wright Street.


