Kitchen caddy instructions

Your kitchen caddy is used to collect food scraps in the kitchen before you place them in your FOGO bin.



Caddy

Line the caddy with your compostable liner or use without a liner.



Food scraps

Place all your food scraps in the caddy and other compostable material like coffee grounds and paper towels.



Bins

After 2-3 days, or once the liner is full, place it into your FOGO bin. Food scraps can also be placed loosely in the bin.

Bins out for collection

Place bins out by 6am on collection day with wheels nearest to your house.

Placing your bins correctly

- Please place two bins out for collection each week
- Keep bins 1 metre clear of obstructions e.g. cars, walls, posts.
- Place bins with wheels nearest to your house.
- Make sure your bin is not too heavy. If it weighs over 70kg it will not be collected.
- Make sure your bin is not overflowing and the lid is properly closed.



Properties without FOGO, such as Commercial and some multi-unit/high density dwellings, should present their waste bin every week.





Bin collection schedule - AREA TWO

Bulk bins

To order a bulk bin or on demand collection, visit belmont.wa.gov.au or call the City of Belmont's waste contractor, Veolia, on 9350 7182. Veolia will take your bulk bin order and provide a reference number over the phone. Waiting times can vary according to demand.

Green or white bulk bins

Most residential properties (except for medium and high density residential) within the City are entitled to four free bulk bins each financial year. You can choose between white bins for household material and green bins for garden waste.

Using the green bins for green waste such as branches, fronds, prunings and lawn clippings (not turf or sods) is a great way to reduce landfill as your green waste will be made into mulch.

- Weekday white bulk bins, are usually delivered on either Monday and will remain on site until Friday.
- Weekend white bulk bins, are usually delivered on a Wednesday or Friday and will remain onsite over 5 days.
- **Green bulk bins** will be delivered on a Tuesday or Thursday and removed the following Tuesday or Thursday.

Bulk bin tips:

- Leave the bin where it has been placed by the Veolia driver.
- Keep the area around the bin clear so the Veolia driver can easily remove the bin.
- If a bin needs to be emptied by the City due to misuse, you will be responsible for costs incurred.
- Do not fill the bulk bin over the top of the bin edge.
- Do not have contents sticking out at angles above the top of the bin as this can interfere with the truck's lifting equipment.

If you need to dispose of much bulkier items, you may be eligible to exchange one bulk bin entitlement for a waste disposal voucher to the Ranford Road Resource Recovery and Waste Transfer Station (6X4 trailer). The location of the facility and other details are shown on the waste disposal voucher.

Waste disposal vouchers can be collected at the City of Belmont's Civic Centre at 215 Wright Street, Cloverdale. Please note, waste disposal vouchers cannot be used for asbestos, mattresses or tyres.

White bulk bin for general waste



Accepted items include:

- General household material
- Bulky household items
- Furniture (except lounge suites)
- Junk (too large for red-top bin)
- Timber (treated pine and other)
- Toys (damaged)

Not accepted:

- × Greenwaste
- × Mattresses

Greenwaste bulk bin for greenwaste only



Accepted items include:

- Loose greenwaste including palm fronds
- Leaves and prunings (up to 150cm in length and 15cm in diameter)
- Flowers and bedding plants
- Weeds and grass clippings (no lawn sods)

Not accepted:

As this material is made into mulch, do not place greenwaste in plastic bags or contaminate the bin with non-green material.

What you cannot put in either bulk bin:

- × Asbestos
- × Hazardous waste of any kind (chemicals and medical waste)
- × Liquid waste of any kind
- × Car parts including tyres
- $\pmb{\times}$ Builders waste including bricks, pavers, sand, tiles and concrete
- Fridges and freezers
- × Lawn with soil and sand
- × E-waste (TVs, computers, cables etc.)

Bulk bins

Household hazardous waste

There are many household waste and recyclable items that cannot be placed in either your General Waste Bin or your Recycling Bin. These products are classed as Household Hazardous Waste (HHW). HHW items including aerosol cans and batteries cause fires in collection vehicles and material sorting facilities, so must not be placed in either of your kerbside bins.

HHW can be safely disposed of for free at the Ranford Road Resource Recovery and Waste Transfer Station.

- Up to 20kg/L per material type
- No commercial quantities

On demand collection service

If you are a resident in the City of Belmont, you can request a collection of up to four items every financial year.

- Fridge or freezer
- Bed base
- Mattress
- Lounge suite
- Other white good item (e.g. stove, washing machine)
- BBQ (no gas cylinders)

Please note, you cannot bring allocations forward from the next

financial year or carry over unused allocations into the following financial year.

Please leave any items you have booked to be collected in a visible location near the front of your property line but not on your verge a couple of days before your scheduled collection day.

- Sheets must be wrapped flat, taped and bound in black builders' plastic.

When: Saturday 5 July 2025, Sunday 21 September 2025, Saturday 6 December 2025 and Sunday 15 March 2026

Time: 9am to 1pm
