Kitchen caddy instructions

Your kitchen caddy is used to collect food scraps in the kitchen before you place them in your FOGO bin.



Caddy

Line the caddy with your compostable liner or use without a liner.



Food scraps

Place all your food scraps in the caddy.



Bins

After 2-3 days, or once the liner is full, place it into your FOGO bin. Food scraps can also be placed loosely in the bin.

Bins out for collection

- Please place two bins out by 6am for collection each week.
- Bins should be retrieved at the latest by the evening of servicing.
- Make sure you follow the rules for what you can put into each bin.
- Place bins within 1m of the road with wheels nearest to your house, clear of obstructions.
- Make sure your bin is not overflowing and the lid is completely closed.
- If it weighs over 70kg it will not be collected.
- If your bin has not been emptied, please wait until 3pm to phone the City's contractor Veolia on 9350 7182 to arrange a collection.

What can I put in my bins?

FOGO bin

Green lid – Collected weekly

- ✓ Food scraps
- ✓ Vegetables and fruit scraps
- ✓ Meat and dairy scraps
- ✓ Coffee grounds
- ✓ Bread
- ✓ Seafood including shells
- ✓ Eggshells
- ✓ Garden waste
- ✓ Grass clippings, plant cuttings, leaves, flowers and weeds, small branches, twigs
- ✗ NO plastic bags
- ✗ NO nappies
- ✗ NO glass
- ✗ NO packaged food waste



Caddy liners

Certified Australian Standard compostable liners (look for the seedling logo)

Yellow lid – Collected fortnightly

- ✗ NO UHT (long-life) cartons

- ✗ NO aerosols/gas cylinders

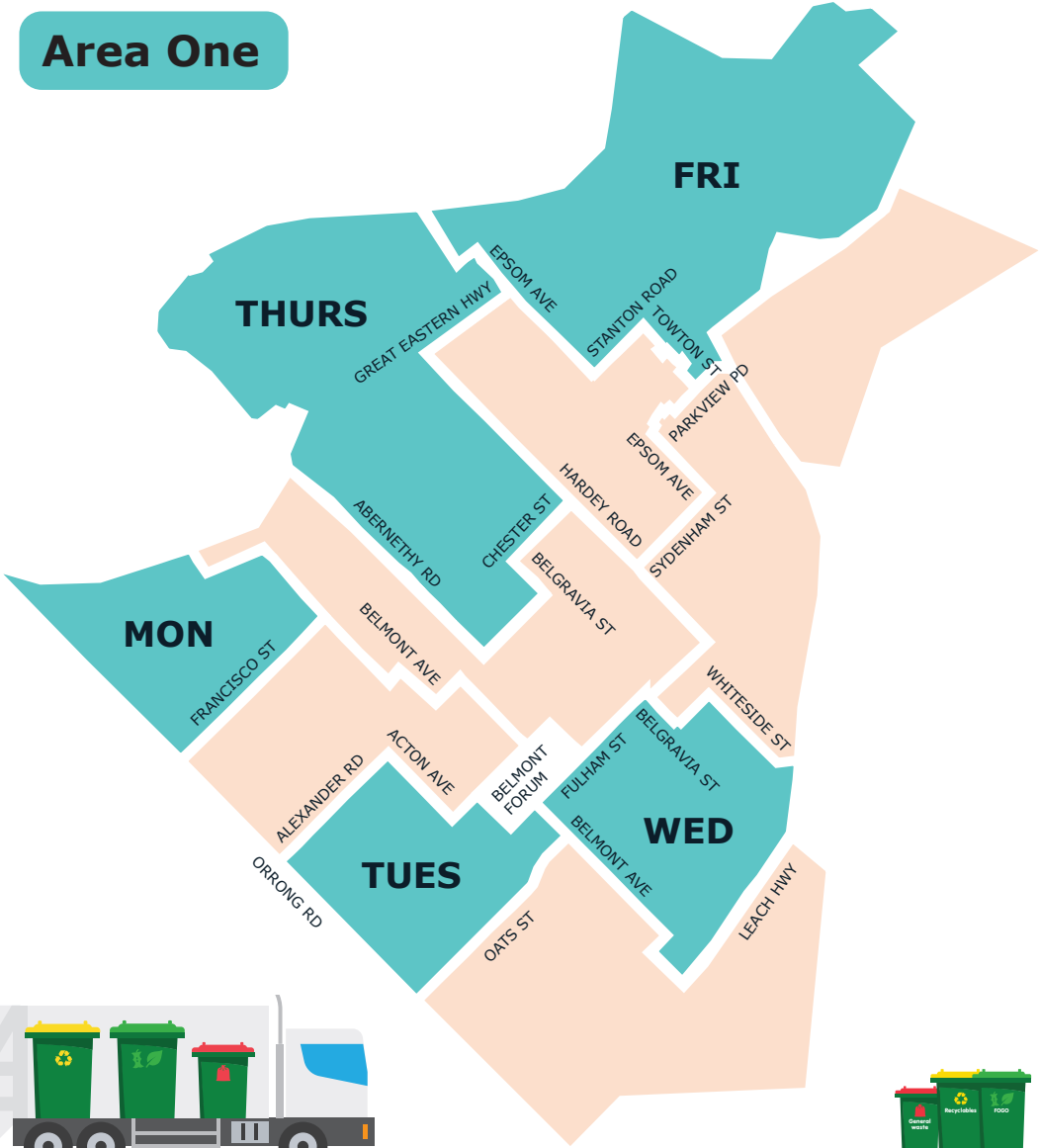

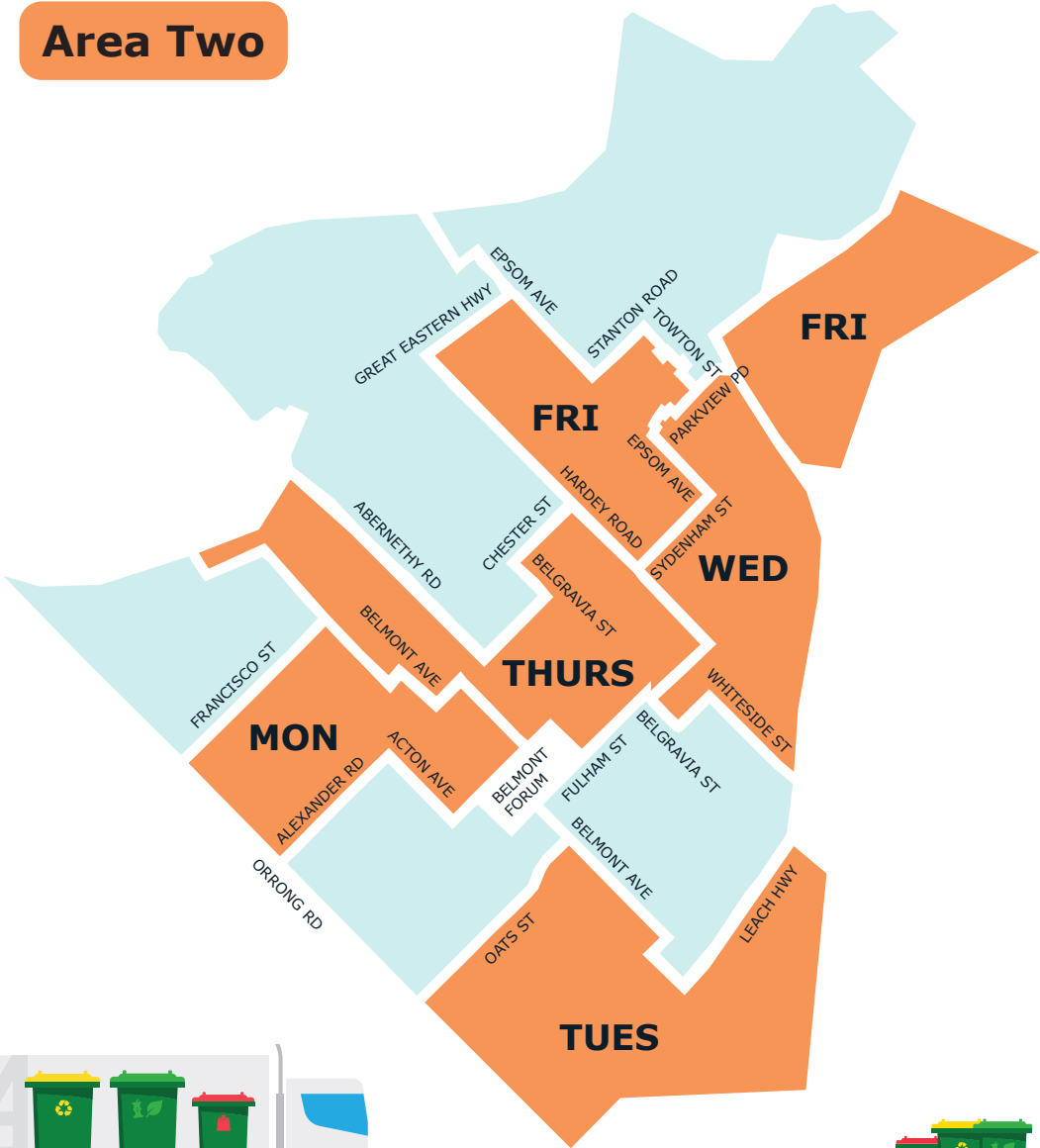

Bulk bins



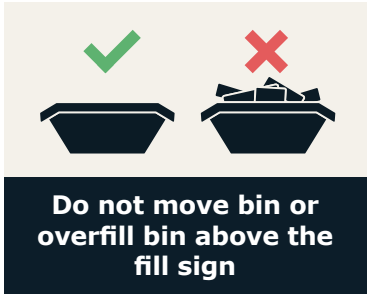
To order a bulk bin or on demand collection, scan the QR code  or call the City of Belmont’s waste contractor, Veolia, on 9350 7182. Veolia will take your bulk bin order and provide a reference number over the phone. Waiting times can vary according to demand.

Green or white bulk bins

Most residential properties (except for medium and high density residential) within the City are entitled to four free bulk bins each financial year. You can choose between white bins for household material and green bins for garden waste.

Bulk bin tips:

- Leave the bin where it has been placed by the Veolia driver.
- Keep the area around the bin clear so the Veolia driver can easily remove the bin.
- If a bin needs to be emptied by the City due to misuse, you will be responsible for costs incurred.
- Do not fill the bulk bin over the top of the bin edge. 
- Do not have contents sticking out at angles above the top of the bin as this can interfere with the truck’s lifting equipment.

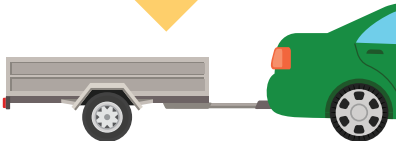

Using your General Waste Bulk Bin



Items accepted:

- ✓ Household furniture - inc. cupboards, drawers, cabinets, tables (no glass tops), chairs etc
- ✓ Garden furniture and equipment inc. outdoor furniture, pots (no plants), garden hose, rakes etc
- ✓ Floor coverings inc. timber, carpet, rugs (no tiles)
- ✓ Bed frames / headboards (not mattresses or bed bases)
- ✓ Old bicycles and exercise equipment etc
- ✓ Broken toys (batteries removed)
- ✓ Household general junk

Items not accepted:

- ✗ Whitegoods, fridges and freezers (book a collection on 9350 7182)
- ✗ Mattresses and bed bases (book a collection on 9350 7182)

- ✗ Lounge suites (book a collection on 9350 7182)
- ✗ Green waste (book a green waste bin)
- ✗ Asbestos (accepted at our Asbestos Drop-off Day)
- ✗ Hazardous waste / gas bottles (Up to 20kg/20L can be taken free of charge to Ranford Road Resource Recovery and Waste Transfer Station: 81 Ranford Road, Canning Vale)
- ✗ Liquids (includes oil and paint)
- ✗ Car parts and batteries
- ✗ Tyres
- ✗ Food
- ✗ Electronic waste (accepted at our Drop-off Days)
- ✗ Building materials
- ✗ Sand, lawn sods, rubble, tiles and bricks
- ✗ Trade / commercial waste

Using your Green Waste Bulk Bin



Items accepted:

- ✓ Branches
- ✓ Fronds
- ✓ Prunings
- ✓ Lawn clippings
- ✓ Tree leaves

Items not accepted:

- ✗ Sand, soil, lawn sods or bagged clippings
- ✗ Plastic bags, plastic containers or plastic pots
- ✗ Hoses or tubes
- ✗ Treated, stained or painted timber

Household hazardous waste

There are many household waste and recyclable items that cannot be placed in either your General Waste Bin or your Recycling Bin. These products are classed as Household Hazardous Waste (HHW). HHW items including aerosol cans and batteries cause fires in collection vehicles and material sorting facilities, so must not be placed in any of your kerbside bins.

HHW can be safely disposed of for free at the Ranford Road Resource Recovery and Waste Transfer Station or at any of the free HHW disposal locations across Perth.

- Up to 20kg/L per material type
- No commercial quantities

- ✓ A maximum of six fence sheets will be accepted.
- ✓ Sheets must be wrapped flat, taped and bound in black builders' plastic.

White goods/E-waste

When: Saturday 4 July 2026, Sunday 20 September 2026,
Saturday 5 December 2026 and Sunday 21 March 2027

Time: 8:30am to 1pm

Accepted items include:

- ✓ Fridges and freezers
- ✓ Air conditioners
- ✓ Dishwashers

Not accepted items:
