

2026 Harmony Student Awards Guidelines and Nomination Form

Guidelines

Harmony Day celebrates Australia's cultural diversity on 21 March, coinciding with the United Nations International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination.

The concept of harmony is about inclusiveness and respect and, more broadly, recognising that everyone belongs, regardless of background or life circumstances.

The City of Belmont's 2026 Harmony Student Award acknowledges and recognises a student who has contributed to creating welcoming community.

Eligibility and Award Details

- Participation is open to schools located within the City of Belmont.
- Schools are responsible for nominating one student to receive a City of Belmont Harmony Student Award by the closing date.
- Nominations are open to students across all year levels.
- It is intended that the Harmony Student Award will be presented during the school's Harmony Week celebrations, aligning with the nationally recognised event.
- Each award recipient will receive:
 - a Certificate of Achievement, and
 - a book voucher valued at:
 - \$100 for secondary school students, or
 - \$60 for primary school students.
- The award will be presented by the Mayor or a Council representative of the City of Belmont at each school.
- Schools are required to provide all relevant details to the City of Belmont as part of the student nomination.

Nominations must be submitted to the City of Belmont by close of business on Friday, 6 March 2026.
