Notice of Motion (Councillor Sekulla) - Support for the Ascot Kilns Statue

Notes from Forum

- The Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage (DPLH) have not shared any background information on the statue such as the name of the artist, how and when the sculpture was made and confirmation of whether the statue is of Sir Lancelot Brisbane, despite requests by the City.
- Without this information, the City is not able to ascertain what possible future costs would be involved. If the statue remains on a State-owned site, the State would be liable for ongoing maintenance costs. Statutory approvals would be required regardless of where the statue is located.
- If the statue is moved to Adachi Park, ongoing maintenance costs would potentially be the City's responsibility.

7.18pm The Manager Governance returned to the meeting.

- City owned Public Artworks are usually undertaken using development contributions. Public Art can also be undertaken by private developers and there is nothing to prevent public artwork on private property though each artwork must have the appropriate approvals in place. The City is happy to work with the State Government to ensure the correct approvals for the statue are obtained.
- The statue (like any other artwork) would then be documented within the City's Art Inventory.

Item 13.2.1 Continued

- If the statue is to be located at the Kilns site, which is State Government owned, the responsibility to comply with building and planning regulations will fall to the State Government.
- Determination of the approvals may fall to the West Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) or through a Joint Development Assessment Panel (JDAP) depending on the circumstances at the time.
- It is understood that the State Government intend removing the statue whilst work on the Kilns is being undertaken and placing it in storage until works are complete.
- The Motion put forward does not commit the City to any future approvals for the statue.

• The Manager Planning Services undertook to make further enquiries with DPLH regarding the background of the statue to ascertain any historical significance.
