Wilson Park Netball Courts Ready for Action

We are thrilled to have officially opened the upgraded Wilson Park Netball Courts.

The recently upgraded Wilson Park Netball Courts and multipurpose courts were officially opened on 27 April by the Hon. David Templeman, Minister for Sport and Recreation, Zaneta Mascarenhas MP Member for Swan, Deputy Mayor Cr Robert Rossi and the Belmont Netball Association.

The \$2.4 million project was jointly funded by the Australian Government, Western Australian Government, the Belmont Netball Association, and the City of Belmont.

It's a newly refurbished home for netball with new LED lighting plus a new multipurpose space including basketball, tennis hit-up wall, wickets and informal game areas.

We are committed to providing opportunities for all members of the community to enjoy the many benefits sport provides socially, physically and mentally.

We hope the Belmont Netball Association and the wider community can enjoy this new recreation space to support healthy, thriving communities.



Hip Hop Ed Empowers Belmont Students

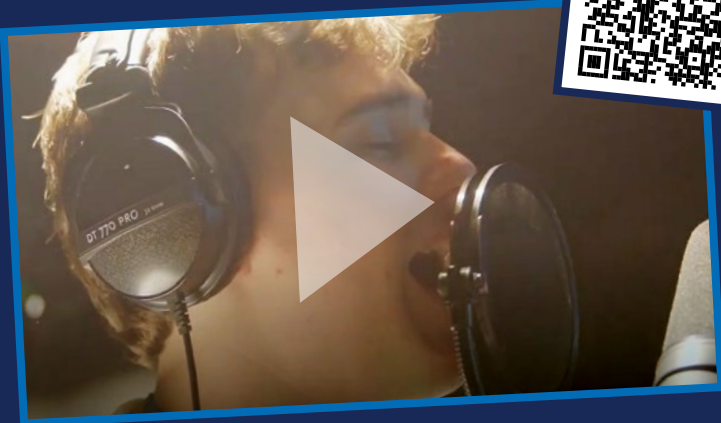
We have released a new video that takes a behind the scenes look at our Hip Hop Ed school program, exploring the program's success and positive impact on students.

Annual Rates Notices for 2023/2024 will be issued on 8 August 2023.

We will be offering a 5% discount on the rate component of your notice if you pay in full by the 12 September due date.

Valuations

The Valuer General of WA will be undertaking a valuation of properties for the 2023/2024 year, leading to a revised gross rental value (GRV) for your property. This revised valuation will then be used to determine your rates.

The proposed rates and charges in the 2023/2024 budget aim to provide for the net funding shortfall of Council's Operational and Capital Program.

If the property valuations were to increase, the City will revise the rates in the dollar downwards to achieve the same overall rates revenue. For example, if there was an increase in property valuations of 10%, the impact on the rate in the dollar would look like this.

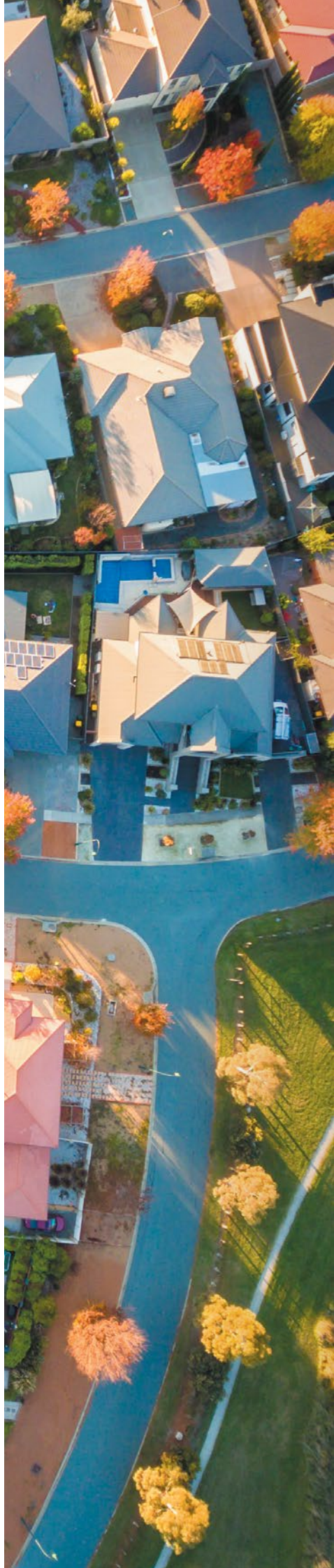

Our staff are here to help you as much as possible. Council has both a Financial Hardship Policy and an Alternative Arrangement Policy.

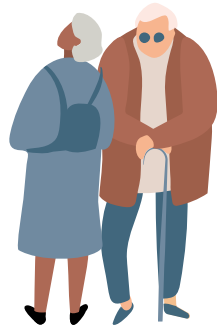

Pensioner and Senior's Rate Concessions

Playground Renewals

As part of our on-going commitment to enhancing the quality of parks and facilities within the community, the playground equipment in Centenary Park was recently replaced, and additional bike track infrastructure was installed at Peachey Park.



Centenary Park (East) Playground

The new design features a multi-play unit that caters for all ages encouraging children to choose an activity that best suits their ability.

A variety of play elements have been included such as climbing, balancing, social play, sand play and swinging. The inclusion of features such as the accessible spinner and ramp promotes inclusive play for all abilities.



Peachy Park Bike Track

New ride-on play features have been added to the Peachy Park bike track.

The new additions include street signs and road markings to help children learn about road rules and safety in a fun and engaging way. More challenging elements have also been added to the riding track.



Tomato Lake

A new, bigger playground at Tomato Lake is coming soon!

The playground located adjacent to the kiosk will be replaced with inclusive and unique play equipment that is suitable for all-abilities.

New landscaping works will increase connectivity between the kiosk, playground and BBQ area. Works are scheduled for mid May to early July 2023.

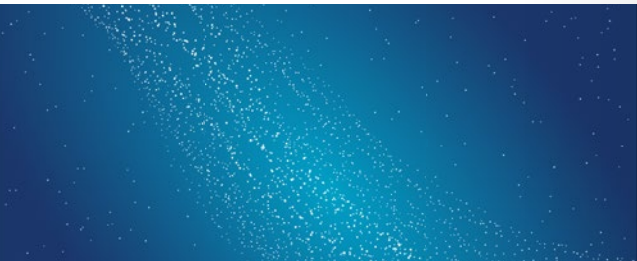

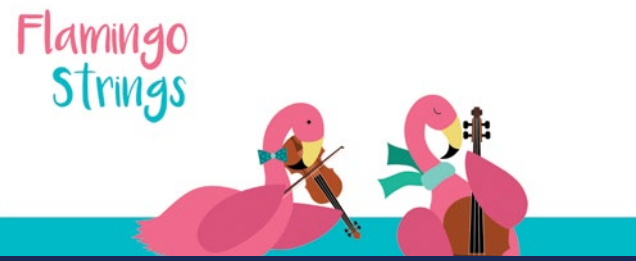

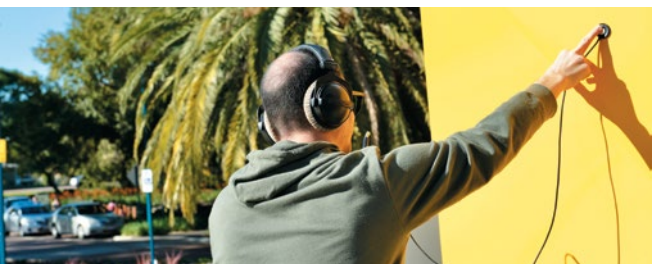

Blast from the Past

Belmont Museum is home to many objects and artefacts that tell the story of our community's history.

A great example is our circa 1930s Westinghouse Refrigerator, located in the hands-on exhibition space.

This refrigerator was used in Andy Norlin's shop on the corner of Wright Street and Belmont Avenue. When he upgraded to a counter fridge, he sold it to Jessie Wells, mother of Peggy Howard (nee Wells). The Wells family home was on the corner of Scott Street and Belmont Avenue. Peggy believes this fridge was the first one in the district.

Library Craft is a Minecraft server with multiple worlds connected by portals. It allows single or multi-player gameplay, and is supported by local councils across Western Australia.

As a 'whitelisted server', Library Craft is only accessible to children aged 7 to 17 years of age, with game moderators there to help players.

Belmont Business Innovation Grant Winners Create Market-leading Robot



Belmont based Nonlinear Solutions have created a robot gantry system that is set to be a game changer for Australian manufacturers. Thanks to their creative engineering and locally-sourced supply chain, their robot gantry system is expected to be less than half the price of comparative systems.

This project was made possible in part by a Belmont Business Innovation Grant from the City of Belmont. The grant kickstarted research and development for the project and helped create a working prototype.

Nonlinear intend to offer training around these products to ensure existing workers get the skills they need to participate in

the advanced manufacturing workforce, which is important for the growth of the local automation and robotics industry.

Innovations like these are at the core of the Belmont Business Innovation Grant program.

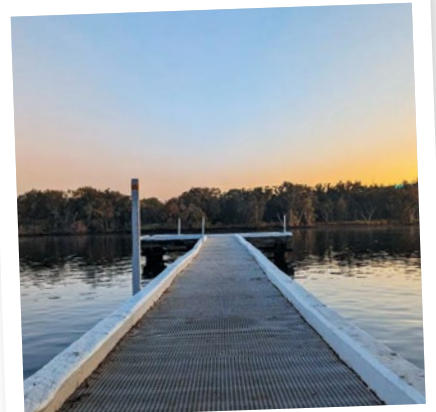
