

Our journey to 125 years

A well-established track through the area was mimicked by what we now recognise as the Great Eastern Highway. At the time of the Swan River Colony, Goorgyp was under the stewardship of the Beeloo Clan under Munday.

By 1830, nearly all the river frontage from Perth to Guildford had been divided into grants, including land located in the current City of Belmont.

The Gold Rush in the 1890s brought people through the Belmont district, as people travelled up Great Eastern Highway - called Guildford Road at the time - to the goldfields. In response to all these travellers, general stores, boarding houses and hotels were built.

As people returned from the Gold Rush, housing developments grew in the area, prompting churches and schools to be built. This also meant the popularity of horse racing grew and in 1897, two new railway bridges and a station next to the racecourse were built.

The Belmont Road Board was established in 1898, the precursor to the current City of Belmont.

The history of the City of Belmont is woven from the countless stories of those who have called this place home, From our First Nations communities who nurtured the land for thousands of years to new arrivals seeking new opportunities, each have contributed their unique traditions, struggles and triumphs to make the City of Belmont what it is today.

It's time to FOGO!

Households across the City of Belmont are getting ready for the community-wide transition to our new three bin FOGO system.

The initial rollout will see more than 32,000 bins and 16,000 kitchen caddy packs delivered to homes between February and April this year. Staged over nine weeks, the rollout will take place 500 households

at a time to ensure residents are supported every step of the way.

Each household will receive the new FOGO bin, general waste bin, kitchen caddy and liners, plus an Information Pack to kick-off their FOGO journey.

The rollout marks the first steps in our journey towards a more sustainable community for all to enjoy.

FOGO. It's not just four letters, it's the City of Belmont's future!

How the FOGO rollout will work

You'll receive a letter in the post letting you know when your new FOGO bin and kitchen caddy are scheduled to arrive.

What to expect on bin changeover week:

- **1.** Place your bins out on your normal bin collection day.
- 2. Your general waste bin (dark green lid) will be emptied and taken away.
- **3.** You will receive a new FOGO bin (lime green lid), general waste bin (red lid) and a kitchen caddy.
- **4.** Inside the kitchen caddy will be free compostable liners and an Information Pack.
- **5.** You can start using your new bins straight away!





CountUSin registrations open

Are you looking to improve your health and wellbeing but don't know where to start?

CountUSin is a 10-week wellness program available to City of Belmont residents 18 years and over who are not working full-time. The program consists of two gymbased group exercise sessions and alternating cooking and outdoor fitness sessions each week led by experienced health professionals.

It only costs \$13.50 per week, and it includes full access to Belmont Oasis Leisure Centre facilities, including gymnasium, swimming pool and group fitness classes outside of program hours. Free creche facilities are also available during gym-based CountUSin sessions.




