Lighting our community

We're lighting up parks and public spaces across the city, to make them more welcoming and accessible for everyone.

Lighting is a clear priority for our community, and while we advocate to Western Power for better street lighting, we're also delivering a range of projects to brighten the spaces we manage.

Each year, we budget for lighting projects through our Capital Works Program.

Current projects include:

- Upgraded sports lighting coming to Middleton Park, Centenary Park, Peet Park and Miles Park.
- Solar powered bollard lighting around Tomato Lake.

- LED lighting upgrades for all existing parks.
- Our Winter Night Lights program, which keeps lights on for longer at four local parks.

We also own a small number of street lights, and are working through our LED replacement program. This will see 84 street lights in Ascot Waters upgraded by the end of the year.

Lighting is also included in the design of upcoming projects at Faulkner Park, Wilson Park, and Belvidere Street, to make sure our community spaces are well-lit year-round.

The 2025 City of Belmont election will be conducted by postal vote and managed by the Western Australian Electoral Commission (WAEC).

Voting closes on Saturday 18 October at 6pm, with vote counting starting immediately after.

This year, the East, West, and Central wards each have one council position to be filled, and the South Ward has two. There is no Mayoral election. Local Government elections use preferential voting, meaning the way you number the candidates on your ballot paper sets your preferences for vote counting.

Make sure your electoral enrolment is up to date on the WAEC website.

If you are a non-resident owner of a property, or lease a commercial property in the City, you can apply to be on the City's Owners and Occupiers Roll.

Belmont Community Environment Champions

In 2023, a group of passionate local residents turned their shared love for the local environment into a powerhouse volunteer group - the Belmont Community Environmental Champions (BCEC).

The last six months have seen the BCEC working with the

community on their Less Mess program to raise awareness of the devastating impacts of litter on our environment.

They engaged over 100 students from local schools in educational workshops and fun activities that shone a light on waste management and protecting our local area.

Through working together, the community collected more than 100 garbage bags of litter, hosted 8 volunteer clean-ups, created a new adopt-a-spot program, and most importantly – built more environmental champions of all ages.

"I've lived in the Belmont area my whole life. We met at a birthday party, later got married, and moved into a place in Kewdale where we've been ever since," said Rob.

"Once our children went to school, I took up volunteering. Fifty years ago I started with Meals on Wheels - I loved meeting people," said Jeanette.

"Twenty-five years ago, Meals on Wheels was short on drivers, so they asked me if I'd do it," added Rob.

Since then, their shared love of community has taken them from Meals on Wheels to the Belmont Museum, where they help look after our local history collection.

With such enduring service, we wanted to know what it is that keeps them coming back. They both said the same thing – it's all about giving back to our community.

Stuart

Stuart has been part of the Belmont State Emergency Service (SES) for 24 years.

We spoke with Stuart for Wear Orange Wednesday during National Volunteer Week, a time to recognise the incredible people behind the high-vis.

"I started at the Belmont SES when I was 19. I lived locally, had an interest in abseiling, and my brothers were also volunteering there," said Stuart.

Stuart is now the Manager of the Belmont SES and has achieved a lot over the years – but it's the people and purpose that keep him coming back.

"It's friendship and camaraderie.

It's learning skills you can't get from behind a desk. And it's rewarding being able to help people when they're in need."
