Notes from Forum

- A Planning for the Future framework is required under the *Local Government Act 1995* and comprises of the Strategic Community Plan, Corporate Business Plan and a number of informing plans including Asset Management Plans, Workforce Plan and a Long-Term Financial Plan.
- The plans have differing timeframes, and review requirements. The Strategic Community Plan spans 20 years and requires a comprehensive review including extensive community and stakeholder consultation every four years. The Corporate Business Plan is a four-year plan and the Long-Term Financial Plan is a ten-year plan, both reviewed annually.
- The Long-Term Financial Plan (LTFP) is an informing document and is workshopped with Councillors at an Information Forum, though not required to be presented to Council for endorsement. As part of good practice of Planning for the Future, an extract of the LTFP is included in the Corporate Business Plan to align the first four years of the LTFP with the actions identified within the Corporate Business Plan. The LTFP informs the preparation of the annual budget.
- The Abernethy Road/Keane Street intersection project is complex and requires further investigation, including consideration in relation to the wider corridor between Leach Highway and Fulham Street, to ensure that a holistic approach is applied to the design process. There is a requirement to consult with service providers such as Western Power and Water Corporation, given the service related infrastructure within the road reserve. Main Roads WA will also be consulted as part of the investigation and design process. Funds are included in the 2022-2023 budget for further investigations.
- Clarification was sought as to the status of the poor quality lighting at the intersection of Robinson and Kew Streets. It was advised that street lighting is a Western Power asset and is therefore not included in the budget. There have been discussions with Western Power in relation to the changeover from mercury vapour to LED lighting and the renewal program for its assets, which will guide future underground power projects.
- The Tomato Lake playground renewal works of \$250,000 included in the budget require further design works. Confirmation will be provided as to which playground is being referred to.

The Director Infrastructure Services undertook to provide further information in relation to:

- Scheduled timing for any upgrades to the courts at the Tennis Club and if any funds are included in this budget.
- Confirmation that the location of the Hardey Road intersection reconfiguration identified in the 2022-2023 Budget is Frederick and Durban Streets.
- Confirmation that the location of the Abernethy Road slip lane extension identified in the 2022-2023 Budget is Alexander Road.
- Confirmation that the playground at Tomato Lake proposed for renewal identified in the 2022-2023 Budget is adjacent to the Kiosk.
