

In Noongar, the title Koort Karnadjil Mya means Heart, Truth, Voice.

The Strategy was co-designed with local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, organisations and businesses.

The Strategy features a digital artwork by Jarni McGuire on the cover which represents the journey and core principles of Koort Karnadiil Mya.

It depicts First Nations people and emphasises the vital importance of their voices. The heart shape, formed by journey lines, symbolises the enduring resilience of First Nations people and our continued path forward together.

Feed your garden with an all-purpose fertiliser



Lightly trim native plants to keep them neat and happy



Let bulb leaves die back naturally before cutting them off



Raise your mower blades and treat your lawn to a feed for fresh growth



Give citrus trees a post-winter boost with citrus fertiliser



Shape hedges early when you see that first burst of new growth



Freshen up your pot plants by swapping out some old soil for new mix



Anne Farrell's Cutouts

Thursday 7 August to Monday 1 October

'Cutouts' is a series of recent paintings by Anne Farrell, a local artist whose work examines how time shapes memory and perception through portraiture.

This work uses layered cutouts and colour shifts to explore the idea that a cutout isolates

its subject, much like memory isolates moments from the past.

Anne Farrell studied at Claremont School of Art and holds a Bachelor of Fine Art from Curtin University.

This work has been developed during a mentorship with renowned WA artist, Kevin Robertson, an opportunity awarded through the 2024 City of Belmont Art Awards.


