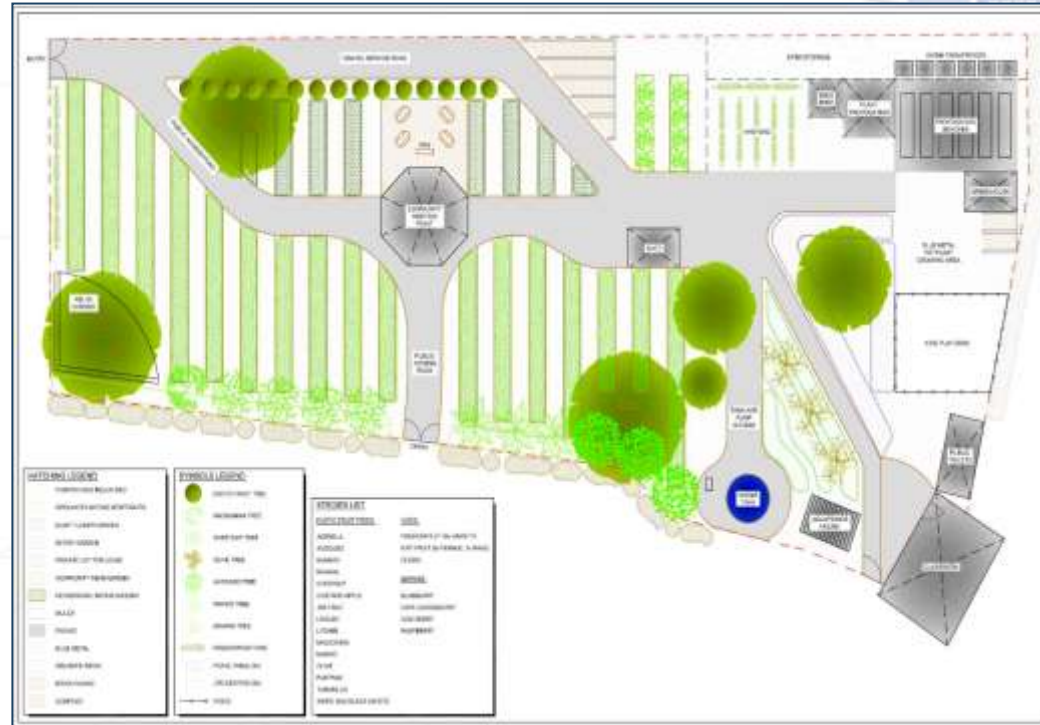

- Approx 36% of all Australian households own a dog
- Tradition of dog friendly parks and facilities in Belmont – exclusive reserves
 - Brearley Avenue Reserve
 - Morgan Park
 - Redcliffe Park
 - Selby Park
 - Parkview chase
- Whiteman Park dog park contains obstacles and is fenced off
- Opportunity to extend exercise activity to economic development with a cafe, pet shop, room for dog training enterprises.....
