



CONNECTING PEOPLE AND PLACES

- Access points to be improved between residential neighbourhoods and high amenity areas (such as the Swan River) and encourage the use of public transport.
- Views to be provided from the Corridor to the Swan River and along main connections to Belmont Town Centre to improve interest and amenity.



- Improving the public domain by enhancing streetscapes through landscaping, activity and built form.
- Creating new, and improving existing, public spaces.
- Encourage walking and public transport use and provide vibrancy and liveability.

FOSTERING EMPLOYMENT & LIVEABILITY

- Balance the Corridor's transport demands with creating a vibrant area where people want to live, work and relax.
- Retain existing employment generators such as office and commercial uses and the light industrial development in the eastern end of the Corridor.
- Emphasise the significance of mixed-use development incorporating mixed retail, office, residential, leisure and entertainment uses within a high amenity setting.



- Improve the status, identity and appeal of the Corridor through built form, activation and the interfaces between buildings and the public realm.
- Creation of pedestrian-focussed activity nodes.
- Connecting urban form with the natural amenity of the Swan River.
