# City of Belmont Little Street Library Guidelines

#### What are Little Street Libraries?

Little Street Libraries aim to promote literacy, build a sense of community and endorse reading. Various little free libraries are being installed in places such as parks, residential properties near schools and child care centres within the City of Belmont. The 'little library' is a simple book swap concept - they are filled with books so that anyone can stop by and collect a book or two, providing they replace the ones that they take with other books.


The City of Belmont supports the installation of little free libraries as they encourage an interest in reading by making books more accessible in different locations in the community.

The following guidelines aim to clarify the scenarios for little libraries situated on private land and those on public land.

CITY OF OPPORT

### LITTLE STREET LIBRARIES ON PRIVATE LAND

The City of Belmont supports Little Street Libraries on private land.



Areas near a driveway within 1.5m of where the driveway meets the front boundary are designated as the Truncation Area as per the Residential Design Codes. These truncation areas ensure safety by providing unobstructed sight lines at vehicle access points. Preferably, little libraries should be located outside of the truncation area. In the event that a little library is located within the truncation area it should not exceed a height of 750mm.

#### LITTLE STREET LIBRARIES ON PUBLIC LAND

The City of Belmont supports Little Street Libraries on public land including neighbourhood parks, where appropriate. However, the City does not support little libraries on verges or road reserves. In the first instance, please contact the City's Placemaking Officer on 9477 7409 to discuss your idea.

Following this discussion, a Little Street Libraries on Public Land application form must be completed with final plans attached for approval.

The City does not provide funding for little free libraries and ongoing upkeep and maintenance is the responsibility of the applicant.

The City of Belmont may remove the little street library should it become a hazard or fall into disrepair. In such a situation, a City Officer will contact the applicant to request the removal. Should the applicant not respond within 7 days, the City will instigate the removal.
