NAIDOC Week celebrates the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. NAIDOC is celebrated not only in Indigenous communities, but by Australians from all walks of life. This year's theme is *Get Up! Stand Up! Show Up!*

The City of Belmont's NAIDOC Student Awards program traditionally recognises Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander (ATSI) students' personal achievement or leading by example.

The City recognises that not all schools have ATSI students enrolled in their schools. However, they do have students who have actively engaged in Aboriginal studies and show great depth of understanding of the Aboriginal history, culture and the importance of reconciliation – those students are eligible for the City's NAIDOC Student Awards program.

Participating schools are responsible for nominating students to receive a City of Belmont NAIDOC Student Award. Nominations for the award are open to all student years.

A framed Certificate of Achievement and a \$50 book voucher will be presented by the Mayor or a Council representative of the City of Belmont at each school *. It is intended that NAIDOC Student Award will be presented during a school assembly before the end of the calendar year in 2022, please advise us of appropriate dates along with the nomination form.
