PAAP Comments Prior to Artist Presentation

- Requested site plan and elevation views to clarify proposed artwork location and street view visibility.
- Queried level of public access and visibility of the artwork.
- Suggested artist consider angling the suspended piece to enhance visibility.
- Sought confirmation that the artwork could be delivered within the \$50,000 budget.

Artist Presentation (Commenced 3:33 PM)

- Presenters: Peter McMeikan (Artist) & Ben Waters (Architect).
- **Project Context:** Mixed-use commercial space; intent is to reflect traffic movement and integrate Severin Walk shapes into design.

Artwork Specs:

- o 7m wide, suspended 6m above ground.
- Constructed from 10x 5mm slatted stainless-steel tubes with LED flex tubes.
- Suspended by cables; heights and lengths varied for visual interest.

Visibility Enhancements:

- Slight angling of piece will improve visibility from road and approaching traffic.
- o Lighting inspired by vehicle headlights/taillights; static colours.

Budget & Feasibility:

- Confident artwork can be delivered for \$50,000.
- Engineering design to be developed based online drawings.

PAAP Decision

• **Outcome:** Unanimous support for the artwork to proceed to design development.

Comments:

 Strong proposal given the modest budget and lack of contingency.

- Angling the piece and positioning it forward enhances public visibility.
- More detailed site, elevation, and placement plans are required to proceed.

5.1.2 2. Development: 191 GEH Belmont – St John Ambulance

• Public Art Coordinator: Alison Barrett

Artist: TBC

 Artwork Commission Fee: \$176,000 (plus \$3,000 for shortlisted artists' concept fees)

• **Developer Contribution:** \$200,000 (ex. GST)

• Coordinator Fee: \$20,000

Artist Presentation (4:23pm):

- Presented by Jahne Rees (artist), Alison Barrett (consultant), and Bianca Lombardo (architect). Sharyn Egan was an apology.
- Concept explores connection to land through sourcing rocks from local/regional sites.
- PAAP raised concerns over cultural sensitivity of using rocks from various areas. Artist confirmed intent to consult Elders.
- Artwork is road-visible and lit with up-lights around a circular plinth.
- Design Development presentation expected by June 2025.

PAAP Decision:

- Unanimous support to proceed to Design Development stage.
- Artwork noted for its innovation and relevance to local history, community, and identity of St John.
- PAAP endorsed use of regional materials, conditional on appropriate cultural consultation with relevant community representatives.

• **Artist:** Adam Cruickshank

• Artwork Commission Fee: \$185,000

• **Developer Contribution:** \$189,000

Pre-Presentation Discussion:

- PAAP queried the \$18,000 allocation for two prototypes as potentially excessive and atypical.
- Recommendation to review prototype scope in future selection processes.

Artist Presentation (2:47pm):

- Presented by Adam Cruickshank (artist), David Smith (landscape architect), and Jack Tesser (National Storage).
- Addressed feedback from March meeting, including:
 - MRWA consultation underway regarding artwork visibility and safety.
 - Updated plans show precise artwork location, elevation, and relationship to trees/road.
 - Landscaping plan submitted showing scale of proposed vegetation.
 - Materials confirmed: stainless steel rods (polished/raw), powder-coated aluminium birds (red), and yellow box with 20year warranty.
 - Lighting to illuminate interior; programmable colours; further confirmation required from MRWA.
 - Climb-ability addressed: no foot/hand holes under 1.5m; safety audit submitted (low-moderate risk).
 - One prototype bird (half-size) presented; design strengthened with shorter poles.

PAAP Discussion & Feedback:

- Noted use of company (yellow) colours potentially contradicts original brief.
- No planning policy prohibits company colours; suggested discussion with National Storage regarding brief compliance.
- Safety audit acknowledged.

PAAP Decision:

- Unanimous support to proceed to Design Development stage.
- Commended adjustments to placement, safety, and visual accessibility.

	 Confirmation from National Storage re: use of yellow and alignment with brief.

6.1	Update on Acknowledgement of Country Artwork at Belmont Hub Wright St Entrance.
	 Shane Yondee Hansen and Jahne Rees were contracted to complete the commission.
	 Stage 1 of the commission (ramp wall design and sculptures in the planter) was completed in July 2024.
	 Stage 2 (ground-based work) has been delayed indefinitely due to the defective paving issue at the front of the Belmont Hub Wright St entrance.
	 City Projects team have advised that the defective paving is an ongoing problem, so it is advisable not to proceed with option of transferring the artwork design onto the ground paving.
	• \$24,000 balance remaining in contract fee.
	Jahne Rees from Scapeism has advised that the remaining \$24,000 can be utilised to be apply the artwork design to the vertical plane of the concrete ramp wall on café side of the wall, instead of applying the Artwork design to the ground level pavers.
	AB says the wall needs to be cleaned before the project is started.
	Decision to proceed was approved by PAAP.
