










We are hitting "Rewind" with a two month celebration of all things history!

Do you have a story to tell?

Belmont Museum's oral history program records the memories and experiences of people who have lived, worked, or played in the City of Belmont and the surrounding areas. Their stories are fascinating, sometimes funny, sometimes sad, but always diverse, authentic, and personal.

Official Opening of the Peg Parkin Local History Room

In memory of Peg Parkin AM JP, the local history room will be officially opened as the Peg Parkin Local History room on 12 April 2024, by Mayor Robert Rossi JP.

Peg Parkin was a councillor of the City of Belmont for 18 years from 1987 to 1994, serving 7 years as deputy Mayor and Mayor from 1987 to 1994. She was the City's first female Mayor.

Peg was named a Member of the Order of Australia in 2005 for her service to the local community and was instrumental in setting up the original purpose-built Belmont Museum that opened to the public in 1988.

She was a former Chair of the Belmont Historical Society and was praised for her outstanding voluntary contribution to the City of Belmont's local heritage efforts in the 2022 WA Heritage Awards.

Further dedicating her time as a Justice of the Peace and elected Freeman of the City, Peg received several accolades for her devotion to the City of Belmont.

Whether you are discovering the history of your house or unearthing your family tree, you will find a wealth of research resources in the Peg Parkin Local History Room.

Take a seat at our Belmont Roads Board table where generations of local government officials held meetings and made decisions. Pull out the drawers and discover stories related to characters that helped make the City what it is today.

The Peg Parkin Local History Room is also home to our Oral History Collection where you can discover even more stories that capture the valuable lived history of our City. There are a variety of research resources both in print and online to help you get started with your family history research. Some items are for loan, other (rarer books) must be viewed here.

Visit during Library and Museum opening hours to browse our collection or to start your family history research.

Visit Hamish the Bear!

Have you met Belmont Museum's cutest resident, Hamish the Bear?

Hamish is believed to be from the early 1900s and was painstakingly resorted by our textile conservator Patricia Moncrieff. Hamish the Bear was given his name by a little girl who won the City's Teddy Bear's Picnic naming competition in 2016.

Hamish's patriotic tartan outfit with velvet jacket and beret is reminiscent of World War I era 'Ally-Bears' mascots which were dressed in the uniform of the allied forces.

Find your past with Findmypast! Library and Museum members have access to the wonderful Findmypast online resource in the Peg Parkin Local History Room at Belmont Museum.


Findmypast allows users to access 200 years of history records online, from extensive birth records, census data and obituaries to digitised British newspaper archives.


With over four billion records from across the globe, it has never been easier to connect and build family trees. Visit the Peg Parkin Local History Room and start exploring the past online.




