To: The Mayor of the City of Belmont

- 1. Under section 5.28 of the Local Government Act 1995, the electors of the City of Belmont whose names, addresses and signatures are set out in the attached list and who comprise over 100 electors request that a special meeting of the electors of the district be held.
- 2. The details of the matter to be discussed at the special meeting are –

The proposed development planned for 52 Grandstand Road, Ascot, and the following resident motion;

We, the electors, call upon the Belmont City Council to revoke the decision to sell 52 Grandstand Road, Ascot, to Craigcare; On the grounds that the process has been fundamentally flawed, the residents have been misled and the proposed development, which is not in the resident's best interest, is completely unacceptable.

Furthermore, we believe there has not been genuine engagement from the Belmont City Council with residents and the consultation process has been inadequate.

Refer <u>Attachment 1</u> for an information report providing background information on the process undertaken by the City in relation to the proposed sale and development of 52 Grandstand Road, Ascot.

Item 4.1 Continued

At the 24 May 2016 Ordinary Council Meeting, Council resolved to:

- 1. Agree to lodge a formal Development Application for a residential aged care/apartment complex at 52 Grandstand Road which addresses all the criteria outlined in Council's recommendation of 22 July 2014 including the requirement for public consultation.
- 2. Enter into a Contract of Sale for 52 Grandstand Road, for an amount no lower than the previous valuation, conditional upon all criteria outlined in Council's recommendation of 22 July 2014 being met.
- 3. Authorise the Mayor and Chief Executive Officer to sign all necessary documentation, including the affixing of the Common Seal, to effect these recommendations.

In accordance with point 1 of the Council resolution, a formal Development Application was lodged and the City referred the application to owners and occupiers for comment for the period between Monday 4 July 2016 and Monday 21 July 2016.

Council has considered the proposed disposal of 52 Grandstand Road, Ascot at three previous Ordinary Council Meetings. At the 25 February 2014 Ordinary Council Meeting, Council resolved to approve the public advertisement of the proposed disposal of 52 Grandstand Road, Ascot (refer <a href="Attachment 3">Attachment 3</a>). At the 27 May 2014 Ordinary Council Meeting, Council resolved to further advertise the proposed disposal of 52 Grandstand Road, Ascot (refer <a href="Attachment 4">Attachment 4</a>). Finally, at the 22 July 2014 Ordinary Council Meeting, Council resolved to dispose of 52 Grandstand Road, Ascot to Craigcare, subject to a number of disposal criteria for the purpose of establishing an aged care residential facility and apartment complex (refer <a href="Attachment 5">Attachment 5</a>).
