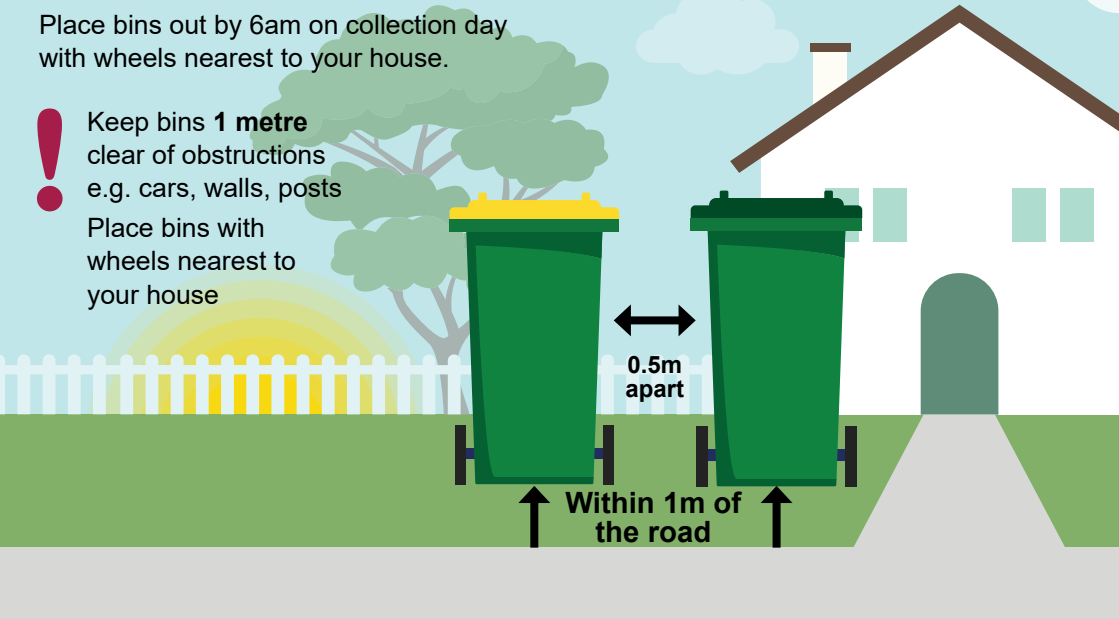

# Bins out for collection

Place bins out by 6am on collection day with wheels nearest to your house.

- ! Keep bins **1 metre** clear of obstructions e.g. cars, walls, posts
- Place bins with wheels nearest to your house

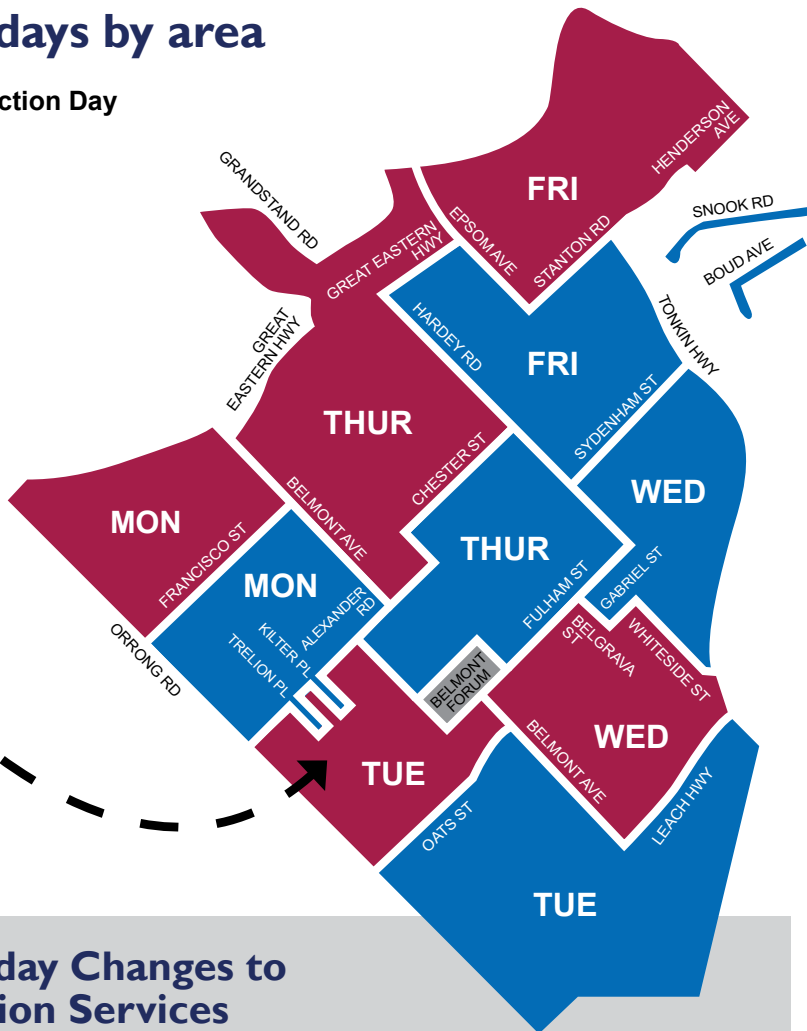

# What can I put in my bins?

## General Waste Bin

Green Lid – Collected Weekly



- ✓ Food scraps
- ✓ Garden waste
- ✓ Nappies
- ✓ UHT (long-life) cartons
- ✓ Old clothing and textiles
- ✓ Soft, scrunchable plastics
- ✓ Hygiene and sanitary products
- ✓ Disposable coffee cups
- ✓ Kitty litter and dog poo
- ✗ NO construction or building materials
- ✗ NO household hazardous waste
- ✗ NO hot ashes
- ✗ NO motor oil
- ✗ NO aerosols/gas cylinders
- ✗ NO batteries
- ✗ NO poisons

## Recycling Bin

Yellow Lid – Collected Fortnightly

Place all items loosely into the bin, not in plastics bags.



- ✓ Glass bottles and jars (remove lids)
- ✓ Steel and aluminium cans (empty)
- ✓ Paper
- ✓ Newspapers and magazines
- ✓ Cardboard (flattened)
- ✓ Plastic bottles and containers (remove lids)
- ✓ Milk and juice cartons
- ✗ NO UHT (long-life) cartons
- ✗ NO nappies
- ✗ NO shredded paper
- ✗ NO soft plastics
- ✗ NO polystyrene
- ✗ NO aerosols/gas cylinders
- ✗ NO batteries
- ✗ NO poisons

# Bulk Bins, On Demand Collections and Drop-off Days

To order a bulk bin or on demand collection, visit [belmont.wa.gov.au](http://belmont.wa.gov.au) or call the City of Belmont's waste contractor, Suez, on **9350 7182**. Suez will take your bulk bin order and provide a reference number over the phone. Waiting times can vary according to demand.

## Green or Blue Bulk Bins

Most residential properties (except for medium and high density residential) within the City are eligible for four bulk bins each financial year. You can choose between blue bins for household material and green bins for garden waste.

Using the green bins for greenwaste such as branches, fronds, prunings and lawn clippings (not turf or sods) is a great way to reduce landfill as your greenwaste will be made into mulch.

- **Weekday blue bulk bins** will, on most occasions, be delivered on either Monday or Tuesday and will remain on site for three evenings and two days.
- **Weekend blue bulk bins**, on most occasions, will be delivered on a Thursday or Friday and will remain onsite over the weekend.
- **Green bulk bins** will be delivered on a Wednesday and removed the following Wednesday.



## Bulk bin tips:

- Leave the bin where it has been placed by the Suez driver.
- Keep the area around the bin clear so the Suez driver can easily remove the bin. Bins delivered full will be emptied the same day.
- If a bin needs to be emptied by the City due to misuse, you will be responsible for costs incurred.
- Do not fill the bulk bin over the top of the bin edge.
- Do not have contents sticking out at angles above the top of the bin as this can interfere with the truck's lifting equipment.

If you need to dispose of much bulkier items, you may be eligible to exchange one bulk bin entitlement for a waste disposal voucher to the Canning Landfill and Recycling Facility (6x4 trailer). The location of the facility and other details are shown on the waste disposal voucher.

Waste disposal vouchers can be collected at the City of Belmont's Civic Centre at 215 Wright Street, Cloverdale. Please note, waste disposal vouchers cannot be used for asbestos, mattresses or tyres.

### Blue Bulk Bin for general waste

#### Accepted items include:

- ✓ General household material
- ✓ Bulky household items
- ✓ Furniture (except lounge suites)
- ✓ Junk (too large for green-top bin)
- ✓ Timber (treated pine and other)
- ✓ Toys (damaged)

#### NOT ACCEPTED:

- ✗ Greenwaste
- ✗ Mattresses

### What you **CANNOT** put in either bulk bin

#### NOT ACCEPTED:

- ✗ Asbestos
- ✗ Hazardous waste of any kind (chemicals and medical waste)
- ✗ Liquid waste of any kind
- ✗ Car parts including tyres
- ✗ Builders waste including bricks, pavers, sand, tiles and concrete
- ✗ Fridges and freezers
- ✗ Lawn with soil and sand

### Greenwaste Bulk Bin for greenwaste only

#### Accepted items include:

- ✓ Loose greenwaste including palm fronds
- ✓ Leaves and prunings (up to 150cm in length and 15cm in diameter)
- ✓ Flowers and bedding plants
- ✓ Weeds and grass clippings (no lawn sods)

#### NOT ACCEPTED:

- ✗ As this material is made into mulch, **DO NOT** place greenwaste in plastic bags or contaminate the bin with non-green material.

# Household Hazardous Waste

There are many household waste and recyclable items that CANNOT be placed in either your General Waste Bin or your Recycling Bin. These products are classed as Household Hazardous Waste (HHW). HHW items including aerosol cans and batteries cause fires in collection vehicles and material sorting facilities, so must not be placed in either of your kerbside bins.

HHW can be safely disposed of for free at the Canning Waste Transfer Station.

- Up to 20kg/L per material type
- No commercial quantities

## The Three Bin System Is On The Way!

The City of Belmont will be rolling out the three bin system. For the latest information, visit [belmont.wa.gov.au/fogo](http://belmont.wa.gov.au/fogo).



From November 2022, residual waste will be diverted from landfill to the East Rockingham Waste to Energy Plant. The initiative will significantly reduce waste to landfill and reduce carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) emissions.



## On Demand Collection Service

If you are a resident in the City of Belmont, you can request a collection of one of each of the following item types every financial year.

- 1 x Fridge or freezer
- 1 x Bed base
- 1 x Mattress
- 1 x Lounge suite
- 1 x Other white good item (e.g. stove, washing machine)
- 1 x BBQ (no gas cylinders)

Please note, you cannot swap item allocations (e.g. 3 x mattresses and 2 x fridges), bring allocations forward from the next financial year or carry over unused allocations into the following financial year.

Please leave any items you have booked to be collected in a visible location near the front of your property line but **NOT ON YOUR VERGE** a couple of days before your scheduled collection day.

## Asbestos Drop-off Days

When: Sunday 11 September 2022 and Sunday 12 March 2023

Time: 9am to 2pm

Where: City of Belmont Operations Centre, 180 Planet Street, Carlisle

Accepted items include:

- A maximum of six fence sheets will be accepted.
- Sheets **MUST** be wrapped flat, taped and bound in black builders' plastic.

## White Goods Drop-off Days

When: Sunday 18 September 2022 and Sunday 19 March 2023

Time: 9am to 2pm

Where: City of Belmont Operations Centre, 180 Planet Street, Carlisle

Accepted items include:

- Fridges and freezers
- Air conditioners
- Dishwashers
- Ovens/Microwave ovens
- Washing machines and dryers
- Bicycles, barbecues, safes, roller shutters and scrap metal.

Also accepted on both drop-off days:

- Mattress and bed bases (all sizes)
- Vehicle batteries
- Plate glass
- Engine oil (maximum 60L in containers no larger than 20L each)
- E-waste
